The kernel of this writing is to rally all stakeholders once again, as the Editorial Board has always done, to eschew whatever is capable of wrecking the peace of this academic community.

The political leadership of the institution, ably represented by the Governing Council under the chairmanship of Professor Maureen Ongoebi Etebu has shown commitment to its steady growth and prosperity since its official

inauguration. The series of marathon meetings with ALL stakeholders during its Inaugural meeting amply demonstrates this commitment.

The Council moved in

## FPA GETS NEW DEPUTY RECTOR, ACADEMICS AS DADA BOWS OUT

r. Aderemi Akinyemi has been elected the Deputy Rector Academics of the Federal Polytechnic, Ado Ekiti.

His election was consummated by the Academic Board during its meeting held on Wednesday, 16<sup>th</sup> October, 2024 following the expiration of the tenure of Dr. Olusegun Dada after four years in the saddle.

Dr. Akinyemi was declared elected by the Chairman of the Academic Board, the highest decision-making organ of the Institution on Academic matters, the Rector, Dr. Temitope John Alake having scored 74 votes as against his opponent, Dr. Kayode Elegbeleye who scored 32 votes.

The Election of Dr. Akinyemi

has since been ratified by the Institution's Governing Council and inaugurated into office. He is expected to serve a single tenure of four years.

The two candidates who contested the election, Dr. Akinyemi and Dr. Elegbeleye we re nominated in accordance with the provisions of the Polytechnic

Act of 2019, before their election by the Board.

Dr. Akinyemi, a Chief Lecturer in the Department of Science Laboratory Technology in the School of Science and Computer Studies joined the services of the Polytechnic in the year 1992 as a Lecturer and rose through the ranks to become a Chief Lecturer.

Dr. Akinyemi, a widely published scholar with over 36 publications in different journals and Conference presentations holds a Doctor of Philosophy (Ph.D) in Biological Sciences (Metabolomics), a Master of Science in Microbiology, Postgraduate Diploma in Computer Science and a Bachelor of Science in

Microbiology.

He attended the Aberystwyth University Wales, United Kingdom, The University of Ibadan, Federal University of Technology, Akure, the University of Ilorin and the Federal School of Art and Science, Ondo, amongst others.

Dr. Akinyemi, a renowned author is a member of the Biotechnology-society of Nigeria, (BSN) Nigeria Society of Microbiology (MSN), Mycological Society of Nigeria (MYCOSON).

He has held some positions of responsibilities at the Institution, as he is also an external examiner to some Polytechnics across the Country and a member of the 12<sup>th</sup> Governing Council of the Federal Polytechnic, Ado Ekiti representing the Academic Board.

# IT CERTIFICATE NOW MANDATORY FOR POLYTECHNIC GRADUATES SAYS NBTE



he National Board for Technical Education, NBTE has said Polytechnic students must now obtain the Industrial Training Mandatory Certificate in order to be mobilized for the National Youth Service Corps, NYSC.

The NBTE Director of SIWES/NYSC Liaison, Mallam Dauda Baba Halah who made this known at the exit interview of the SIWES Accreditation exercise held at the Institution, noted that the exercise is to make the Institution better and to ensure that the students have firsthand experience in their course of study.

Mallam Dauda Baba Halah stated that it was important to put in place some safety measures, equipment/facilities in the Students' Industrial Work Experience Scheme, SIWES office in order to avoid unnecessary errors and to maintain a good working environment for the staff and students.

He also recommended a proper student's industrial

training logbook for the Institution and maintained that information about SIWES should be included in the students' handbook for them to be aware of the courses available for such programmes.

The NBTE Director of SIWES/NYSC Liaison noted that the tenure of Departmental SIWES Coordinators should not be more than two years to give room for others to understudy and serve in such position.

Rector of the Federal Polytechnic, Ado-Ekiti, Engr. (Dr) Temitope John Alake appreciated the Director for making efforts at ensuring that the needed manpower and facility improvement are put in place to move the Institution forward.

The Rector, who was represented by the Deputy Rector, Academics, Dr. Aderemi Akinyemi assured the Director of the Management's readiness to improve on the services of the SIWES office for optimal results.

Dr. Akinyemi stated that the Polytechnic is not resting on its oars, as there are various ongoing projects that would be completed in no distant time.

He added that the next edition of the students' Handbook and prospectus would capture information on SIWES to keep the students abreast of necessary information.

rug Abuse has been described as a dominant malaise among youths in the Country and needs to be nipped in the bud.

This canker worm, which is fast becoming a prevalent vice is most unacceptable and all hands must be on deck to curb it.

The Rector of The Federal Polytechnic Ado Ekiti Engr. (Dr) Temitope John Alake made this assertion when he received in audience the Executive Council members of the Nigerian Youths Council (NYC) from the 16 Local Government Areas in Ekiti State.

Dr. Alake noted that the Youths of today will become the adults of tomorrow therefore they need to be regulated and moderated to make them better and prosperous adults of tomorrow.

Speaking further Dr. Alake said the government is now paying attention to skill acquisition as this has become inevitable, "the white-collar jobs are no longer available; hence emphasis is now placed on the acquisition of skills for the teeming Youths population. "When you don't have skills, you have nothing to fall back on even after your education, hence the Youths needs to be encouraged to embrace professional courses and vocational Technical Education from the Secondary School".

He however called on the government to further encourage the youths to pick up vocational skills by paying them stipend in the course of their training as this will go a long way in motivating them.

Earlier in their submission, the Chairman of NYC, Ekiti Aare Adedara Tope who led the delegation promised their support and cooperation to the Management of the Institution as led by Dr. T.J Alake

He also noted that they were out to continue to promote the legacies of the founding fathers of Ekiti State through its sustainability, as this is part of the objective of the Council.

Furthermore, as part of its programmes they have resolved to embark, on a campaign to discourage drug abuse among youths in the State. The campaign they noted will be held in all towns and villages of the state. This is with a view to discouraging the youth from taking illicit substances

He however solicited for the support of the institution to make the campaign a success.



# REGISTRY STAFF ADMONISHED TO BE DEDICATED, MORE COMMITTED TO DUTY

egistry Staff of the Federal Polytechnic, Ado-Ekiti have been admonished to improve on their job, embrace the spirit of oneness and extend a helping hand to one another to move the Registry and the Institution forward.

The Registrar of the Institution, Mrs. Folashade Akintola gave the admonition in a meeting with various Heads of Directorate/Units and members of the Registry respectively.

Mrs. Akintola who appreciated God for bringing everyone into the New Year safely noted that the Registry would take a new turn, as meetings will be held from time to time in order to brainstorm and profer solutions to whatever challenges in the various Directorates/Units.

The Registrar maintained that the quarterly in-house training and retraining of staff and the Annual Registry Lecture Series will be set in motion and called on all Heads of Directorates/Units to encourage their subordinates to key into the idea as it would help boost their career, and a lot of errors would be avoided on the job.

She added that attending conferences just to get certificates is not enough but members of staff must be ready to present papers at such meetings to improve themselves

and be well informed

Mrs. Akintola also urged members of staff who have been posted to various schools to work in the interest of the Registry wherever they are posted to.

The Registrar further stated that the Registry Ceremonies Committee that was set up in the previous year has been able to come up with a lot of ideas that would help move the Registry forward.

"The welfare scheme/Ceremonies Committee held series of meetings and has come up with a detailed report. The committee recommended the creation of Registry WhatsApp platform, which has already been created".

"They also recommended that members of staff will be contributing some amount of money monthly. Staff from level 1-6 will be paying a sum of one thousand naira, while level 7-14 will be contributing two thousand naira making it a yearly contribution of twelve thousand naira and twenty-four thousand naira respectively".

She opined that the contribution would be used to generate revenue for the Registry, end of year gettogether, celebration of retirees, award of excellence to staff with excellent performance and cash gifts would be given to Staff who have one celebration or the

The Rector, while thanking members of staff for their cooperation and commitment towards work, admonished all to keep up the good work, be considerate of one another, inject patriotic ideas into junior colleagues coming behind and keep praying for the Management of the Institution.

He also appreciated some members of staff who represented the Institution in Abuja at a National Research exhibition programme put together by TetFund code name TETFAIR2 "Out of six critical projects that were approved, two were selected from the Polytechnic. We got patency for one of the products through the help of TetFund. The other one is called a Language Translator, first of its kind. They will all be celebrated", he added.

Dr. Alake maintained that there is an urgent need for members of staff to upgrade their qualifications and be ICT compliant.

"Some circulars have been flying around that the Federal Government will be going digital in no distant time. If you find out that your certificate is no longer obtainable, try as much as possible to upgrade yourself. The Skill Development Centre is opened to everyone. I implore you to go there and register. There is a position of quality assurance assessment, which is compulsory for the Principal Officers", he added.

He also stated that members who have applied for conversion should equip themselves ahead of the interview.

The Rector further said that there is no approval for recruitment at the moment but the Institution is hoping that the Federal Government is able to raise the personnel budget in order to accommodate new members of staff into the Polytechnic.

He added that the promotion arrears from 2018 till date has been compiled and forwarded to the appropriate quarters due to the Polytechnic's exit from IPPIS and hoped that the money will be paid in no distant time.

Dr. Alake stated that the license fee for the Polytechnic

Radio, 97.5FM, has been paid and it will start airing after all other necessary measures have been put in place.

He called on members of staff who have connections with philanthropists and other well-meaning individuals in the society, to prevail on them to invest in the Institution by bringing in various things that will expand the Polytechnic and in turn help the people.

The Rector frowned at some members of staff who are fond of writing petitions and advised them to desist from such act instead embrace the Alternative Dispute Resolution channels to air their grievances.

On the issue of security, he noted that it is the business of everyone to be observant and vigilant about what is going on in the Polytechnic.

While corroborating the appeal of Dr. Isaac Oladipo on indiscriminate bush burning, the Rector added that members of the Polytechnic community should be careful of burning their refuse as we have approached the dry season.

Giving the vote of thanks, the Registrar, Mrs. Folashade Akintola appreciated everyone for coming out in their large numbers even with such short notice, adding that it is a testament to the strength and commitment of members of staff to the Institution.

Mr. Akintola appealed to everyone to continue to work towards the progress of the Polytechnic and prayed that the Institution will continue to move forward.



## SCIENTISTS CHARGED TO BE SOLUTION-DRIVEN

scientists have been called upon to transform their ideas into actionable plans that can be implemented at various levels of their professions to drive economic growth, create job opportunities and enhance national security.

This was the conclusion reached at the 9th Biennial International Conference of the School of Science and Computer Studies, which has as its theme, "Innovative and Scientific Solutions for Economic Revitalisation, Job Creation and Security in Nigeria".

The Rector of the Federal Polytechnic, Ado Ekiti, Dr. Temitope John Alake, noted that the Conference came at a very crucial time where the Country is being faced with major challenges such as e c o n o m i c r e c e s s i o n, unemployment and insecurity among others.

Dr. Alake, who was represented by the Deputy Rector of Administration, Dr. Michael Akinola, stated that it was noteworthy to see that researchers are continually seeking solutions to eradicate these challenges.

The Rector maintained that the role of Academia, researchers and in novators cannot be overemphasised in society, and it is important for them to upgrade beyond just identifying challenges but to find solutions that are tailored towards the advancement of the Country.

Earlier in his remarks, the Dean, School of Science and Computer Studies, Dr. Babajide Afolayan, welcomed the participants and appreciated them for the cooperation and commitment shown towards the success of the program.

Dr. Afolayan opined that the drive towards technological advancement can be achieved through the human resources in our immediate environment, and the solutions are obtainable through the various instruments at our disposal.

He urged researchers to look beyond working on research for promotion's sake but focus on channelling their energies and intellect towards ideas and innovations that would bring their potential to limelight.

Dr. Shadrach Akinkuade, the Lead Paper 1 presenter, who spoke on "Innovative Materials for Infrastructure Development and Economic Growth," noted that the deplorable state of infrastructure has been a major concern in Nigeria and it is one of the critical factors in attracting Foreign Direct Investment (FDI) into the economy.

Dr. Akinkuade emphasised the need to break technological barriers through the development and application of innovative materials, getting constant training and experiences from experts of practising scientists, design and manufacturing engineers for students in higher institutions of learning.

The Lead Paper 1 presenter added that the development of innovative materials helps to improve

performance, durability and reduce environmental impact that enabling the creation of resilient and efficient infrastructural systems.

He also encouraged researchers to embark on innovative research that would pose a challenge to the existing paradigms of "Publish or perish" and explore emerging fields such as Artificial Intelligence and Machine Learning to address problems with creative solutions that will transform industries, societies and human experiences.

The Lead Paper 2 presenter, Mr. K.S.O. Ibikunle, who spoke on "Facts, Figures and Falsehood. Rediscovering Data Relevance as First Step towards True Economic Recovery", stated that Data and Statistics provide a basis for avoiding errors, increasing the accuracy of analytics that enables the government to formulate policies, allocate resources and identify investment opportunities.

Mr. Ibikunle reeled out some challenges facing data collection and use in Nigeria, such as corruption, dishonesty, inadequate data collection training, lack of cooperation, insecurity, inadequate legal backing and deliberate alteration to suit purpose and need.

He therefore maintained that proper and effective monitoring of the income, population, activities and needs of the people through data would take the country to the path of economic recovery, and continued growth will be a viable vision in the near future.



## FPA TO PARTNER NOA ON VALUE RE-ORIENTATION

he Federal Polytechnic, Ado Ekiti, has expressed its readiness to work hand in glove with the National Orientation Agency (NOA) in its quest to sensitise and restructure the value system of society at large.

The Rector of the Polytechnic, Dr. Temitope John Alake, made this known while playing host to the Ag. State Director of the agency, Mrs. Oluwakemi Akomolede and her team, who paid a courtesy visit to the Institution on Tuesday, 19th November 2024.

# ANTIMICROBIAL RESISTANCE: A THREAT TO THE GAINS OF MODERN MEDICINE

#### **Definition of terms**

Antimicrobials – including antibiotics, antivirals, antifungals, and anti-parasitics – are medicines used to prevent and treat infectious diseases in humans, animals and plants.

Bacteria- are small prokaryotic organisms of the Monera kingdom. Bacteria are generally found in small strains that reproduce rapidly and frequently through asexual means such as binary fission.

Many bacterial species are beneficial to the body and are naturally found in areas such

digestive tract, female genital tract, skin and other parts of the body. Probiotic cultures such Lactobacillus acidophilus live symbiosis with the body. As a matter of fact, only 10% of bacteria are deemed pathogenic. They secrete toxins (chemicals) which can disrupt bodily function and create

infection.

combat infections caused by these organisms are called antibiotics

Fungi are Eukaryotic organisms, they can be

single-celled or multi-cellular, they also reproduce sexually or asexually.

They are no doubt of great economic importance e.g., includes yeasts, mushrooms, moulds and many others. They lack the pigment chlorophyll and hence live as either, saprophytes, parasites of plants and animals and some species infect and cause disease in humans, these diseases include, Aspergillosis, candidiasis Histoplasmosis and a lot more. ANTI-FUNGALS are used in the management of these diseases.

Viruses- are microscopic infectious agents that

replicate only inside living cells. These microbes can infect bacteria, plants and animals. In humans some infections caused by these organisms are self-limiting e.g., include the common cold, while others like Hepatitis B, HIV 1&2 are lifelong and would require a lifetime of **ANTIVIRALS** to curtail. Worthy to mention is that most viral



infections are best prevented with vaccines and safe sex practices.

Parasites-are organisms that live on or within a



host and obtain nutrients at the host's expense. They can cause harm to the host and in rare occasions can also kill the host. They can be categorized as 1) Protozoa e.g., include plasmodium species (Which causes malaria in humans) 2) Helminths e.g., include Tapeworms etc. and 3) Ectoparasites e.g., includes Lice, Ticks etc. Each of these have the potential to cause diseases in humans either through nutrient depletion or tissue damage. Anti-parasitic are antimicrobials used to eliminate these infective organisms in humans.

Antimicrobial Resistance (AMR) occurs when bacteria, viruses, fungi and parasites no longer respond to antimicrobial medicines. As a result of drug resistance, antibiotics and other antimicrobial medicines become ineffective and infections become difficult or impossible to treat, increasing the risk of disease spread, severe illness, disability and death.

As a caveat, antibiotics is a type of antimicrobial, these two words however are used interchangeably, the definitions above is for clarity and distinction and to achieve the aim of this article

#### Introduction:

AMR is a natural process that happens over time through genetic changes in pathogens. Its emergence and spread are accelerated by human activity, mainly the misuse and overuse of antimicrobials to treat, prevent or control infections in humans, animals and plants

The global rise in antibiotic resistance poses a significant threat, diminishing the efficacy of common antibiotics against widespread bacterial infections. The 2022 Global Antimicrobial Resistance and Use Surveillance System (GLASS) report highlights alarming resistance rates among prevalent bacterial pathogens. Median reported rates in 76 countries of 42% for third-generation cephalosporin-resistant E. coli and 35% for methicillin-resistant Staphylococcus aureus are a major concern. For urinary tract infections caused by E. coli, 1 in 5 cases exhibited reduced susceptibility to standard antibiotics like ampicillin, co-trimoxazole, and fluoroquinolones in 2020. This is making it harder to effectively treat common infections.

### Preventive Measures for Antimicrobial Resistance





Antimicrobial resistance (AMR) can't be prevented as microbes adapt to their environment. However, the following are the measures that aid in limiting AMR.

- Spending quality time with a physician to discuss symptoms, resulting in rationalised prescription
- Following the directions exactly provided by a physician
- Avoiding medication sharing
- Avoiding unnecessary antibiotic use
- Avoiding consumption of leftover or stored prescription drugs
- Maintaining a good diet, sleep and hygiene, thereby preventing the need for antimicrobial drugs



### World Antimicrobial Awareness Week

Klebsiella pneumoniae, a common intestinal bacterium, also showed elevated resistance levels against critical antibiotics. Increased levels of resistance potentially lead to heightened utilization of last-resort drugs like carbapenems, for which resistance is in turn being observed across multiple regions. As the effectiveness of these last-resort drugs is compromised, the risks increase of infections that cannot be treated. Projections by the Organization for Economic Cooperation and Development (OECD) indicate an anticipated twofold surge in resistance to lastresort antibiotics by 2035, compared to 2005 levels, underscoring the urgent need for robust antimicrobial stewardship practices and enhanced surveillance coverage worldwide.

Emergence of drug-resistant parasites is a

major threat to malaria control. Artemisinin-based combination therapies (ACTs) are the recommended first-line treatment for uncomplicated Plasmodium falciparum malaria and are used by most malaria endemic countries. Emergence of partial resistance to artemisinin and/or partner drugs in ACTs makes selecting the right treatment more challenging and requires close monitoring. In the Greater Mekong Subregion, partial resistance to artemisinin or a partner drug has been confirmed in several countries since 2001. In the WHO Eastern Mediterranean Region, resistance to a partner drug, sulfadoxine-pyrimethamine, led in some countries to treatment failure requiring a change to another ACT. In Africa, mutations linked to artemisinin partial resistance have been observed in several countries. ACTs that have been tested remain efficacious, but further spread of resistance could be a major public health challenge and improved surveillance is vital.

Causes of antimicrobial resistance: Among many others here are few of practices as it concerns us that result in AMR

**Poor medical practices:** In nations with underqualified health professionals, it is common for antimicrobials to be wrongly prescribed. Treating a viral infection with antibiotics instead of antivirals

will not only be ineffective but also pose a threat of developing drug resistance. This may be due to uncertainty, lack of knowledge, or simply to "be on the safe side."

Overuse of antimicrobials: Generally, people feel re-assured by taking antimicrobials especially antibiotics when they are sick, thinking that they will get better. In many developing countries like ours, antibiotics are commercially available as over-the-counter drugs. Sometimes patient complaints will lead this untrained individual to prescribe antibiotics despite their discretion.

Incorrect dosages: Patients often discontinue their drugs before their medication is done because they start feeling better. When this happens, surviving bacteria or infective organisms, as the case may be, will reproduce to create another infection, but this time they may be tolerant to the administered drug.

#### What is the way out?

Antimicrobial (antibiotic) Resistance is prevalent and can only be minimised through stewardship, and as such, before each antibiotic use it must be:

- 1. Prescribed by an expert in this case, a medical doctor
- 2. The patient must be accountable, making sure to complete a full regimen as prescribed.
- 3. Tailoring of antibiotic use to as at when really needed or necessary, even in animal production

Not forgetting to mention that a practical and effective tool against the spread of antibiotic-resistant bacteria is through hand washing

#### Conclusion:

The misuse and overuse of antimicrobials in humans, animals and plants are the main drivers in the development of drug-resistant pathogens, it puts many of the gains of modern medicine at risk. It makes infections harder to treat and makes other medical procedures and treatments such as surgery riskier. This raises a need for stewardship and education for the proper use of antimicrobials.







he Federal Polytechnic, Ado-Ekiti has been commended for its uniqueness and drive towards the sustainability of qualitative education Giving the commendation at the exit interview of 17 programmes respectively visited for accreditation, inspection and verification exercise, the Executive Secretary of the National Board for Technical Education, NBTE, Prof. Idris Bugaje appreciated the Management of the Institution, for making sure that the programmes are up to standard as well as the provision of an enabling environment for the visit.

The Executive Secretary, who spoke through the Director, Polytechnic programmes Department Dr. Fatima Kabir Umar, stated that the accreditation exercise remains an avenue for students to be given enough opportunity to learn and to find their feet at the end of their programmes in the Institution.

Dr. Fatima Kabir Umar observed and appreciated the Rector and his Management team for working assiduously in maintaining an enabling environment for teaching and learning. She added that the zeal put in place to ensure that the exercise went well was a testament to their love for the Institution.

Responding, the Rector, Dr. Temitope John

Alake stated that he was very pleased to receive the accreditation team and noted that the essence of the exercise will be justified by the team as the strength and areas of improvement being pointed out.

Dr. Alake appreciated the focus of the Federal Government in getting Institutions equipped with the necessary measures and resources needed for students to have skills that are marketable when they graduate.

The Rector stated that despite the current situation, TETFUND has been able to release funds for programme upgrades, Instructional materials, infrastructure, and staff training. He added that the Quality Assurance Assessors have come up with the issuance of certificates for students to learn and be able to hit the ground running at the end of their programmes in the Institution.

He, however, assured that areas of deficiencies pointed out by the resource persons to each programme will be considered, and efforts will be made to improve them to ensure that the Polytechnic grows. He added that the issue of dichotomy is of great concern to Polytechnic education, but there is no giving up.

Resource persons made recommendations for the purchase of required equipment and facilities to enhance various practical sessions for the students, noting that the implementation of such necessary measures would further increase their chances of obtaining the Higher National Diploma.

The team observed that the equipment, laboratories, workshops and studio should be well maintained while stressing the need to sponsor members of staff for seminars in new sustainable areas.
